**Dear Newcomers Members: Things are definitely looking up! Spring has almost arrived in the mountains, most of us are vaccinated, slowly resuming our normal lives. Everyone is anxious to socialize and meet with friends. And, Newcomers is planning to slowly and carefully resume some of our activities.**

The Newcomer's Board met on Zoom in early April and arrived at the following decisions as we move forward:

- We will continue to follow **CDC guidelines**.
- If you joined Newcomers in 2020 or early 2021, your membership is valid until July, 2022. **You will not need to renew this year (2021).**

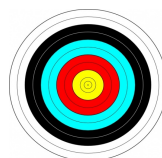
Our goal is to enjoy each others company at dinner (outdoors) following golf.

### ❖ What is Fine Dining?

It's a wonderful way to meet other Newcomers in a more intimate setting. It is for couples and singles who like to cook, eat, and share conversation around the table.

### ❖ How does it work?

Groups of 8 (couples or two singles) dine together monthly at a member's home, rotating locations each month. The Fine Dining Coordinators (Linda Elbert and Joyce Jamele) provide a menu and recipes for each dinner.

- Each group schedules their own dinner dates with each couple taking a turn to host.
- Dates are scheduled in a collaborative manner so the most members of the group can participate.
- If a couple or individual cannot participate, they must notify the host and find their own alternate.
- The host prepares the main course and sets the table. Other group members prepare and bring the other courses (appetizer, salad/soup, dessert).
- Everyone brings their own wine or other beverage of choice

### ❖ What if I can't host 8 people for dinner in my home?

No problem. If you are a single, team up with another single (we can try to help you find a dining partner) who has a home that can accommodate 8 for dinner.

--OR--

You (a couple or a single) can sign up to be an alternate. Alternates do not host dinner, but fill in when regular member(s) can't attend., bringing one of the menu items to the dinner.

### ❖ How do we (I) participate?

Because of the high level of social interaction in this activity group (cooking for one another and dining together in a private home), all Fine Dining participants must be fully vaccinated.
